"Undue hardship" as used in connection with the granting of a variance means the property cannot be put to a reasonable use if used under conditions allowed by the official controls, the plight of the landowner is due to circumstances unique to the property not created by the landowner, and the variance if granted, will not alter the essential character of the locality. Economic consideration alone shall not constitute an undue hardship if reasonable use of the property exists under the terms of the ordinance.
